

Use of Certification Mark and Logo:

- The right to use the Certification Logo of the scheme certification is exclusively valid for the Organization that was audited by the Certification Body.
- The use of the Certification Logo cannot be transferred by the certified Organization to a third party or a successor thereof (e.g. change of Company's name).
- The Certification Logo must be legible, meet the specifications provided in this Protocol and can be clearly seen. The Organization does not have the right to make any kind of change without prior notice of Certification Body NEAR EAST SERVICES (NES).
- The Organization is obliged to use the Certification Logo in such a way as to not create confusion or misleading the public regarding the type of scope audited/assessed by NEAR EAST SERVICES (NES).
- If claims are raised against the Certification Body due to arbitrary, illegal and opposite to the provisions of this Protocol, use of the Certification Logo by the Organization, the Organization is obliged to absolve the Certification Body of any claim of third parties. The same will occur if claims are raised by third parties against the Certification Body for allegations made for promotional purposes by the Organization and do not meet the terms of Certification Logo use or are causing confusion or misleading regarding the type of scope audited/assessed by NEAR EAST SERVICES (NES).
- The organization shall not allow for using the NES certification marks on its products, product primary packaging, laboratory test reports or calibration & inspection reports / certificate.
- The Organization shall not make or permit any misleading statement regarding its certification.
- After suspension or withdrawal of certification, discontinues the use of all advertising means that contain a reference to the certification.
- Revises all promotional forms, when the scope of certification is reduced or amended.
- Does not imply that certification applies to activities that are not included in the certification scope.
- Does not use its certification in such a way that would bring the certification body into disrepute as a result of losing public trust.
